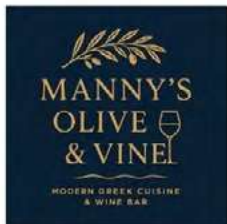

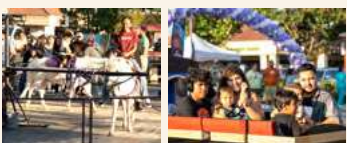

City councilmembers, citizens and students from all the communities in California State Assembly District 62, as well as officials from the state and Los Angeles County, turned out on August 16 for the gala Grand Opening of the new district office at 7300 Alondra Boulevard in Paramount.

Hosting the well-attended event was our District 62 Assemblymember José Luis Solache, Jr., who welcomed everyone to “the party in Paramount!” He emphasized that he wants the new district office to be “a hub for inclusion and engagement and a place where people can gather and have meaningful conversations.” He encouraged his constituents to visit or call the new office at **562-529-3250**.

José Solache was born in Bellflower and grew up in nearby Lynwood, attending local public schools. He earned a bachelor’s degree from California State University, Dominguez Hills, serving two terms as student body president and as the statewide chairperson of the California State Student Association.

A Democrat and former mayor and longtime city councilmember in Lynwood, he won his assembly seat in November 2024 by defeating Republican Paul Jones with 66% of the vote. He is an outspoken advocate for small businesses, lowering college tuition, investing in after-school programs and increasing public safety. “I’m working to strengthen and improve the opportunities that exist here for future generations,” he said.

Currently serving as the chairperson of the Assembly Committee on Economic Development, Growth and Housing Impact, he held a meeting in Paramount on August 15 “to listen to the people on the front lines—our students, small business owners and workforce leaders—and to identify real, actionable solutions that will make our economy work for everyone.”

Hispanic Heritage Month

Observed each year from September 15 to October 15, *National Hispanic Heritage Month* acknowledges and honors the positive role Hispanic culture has played in shaping many different and diverse communities throughout the United States.

Paramount's historical roots are deeply tied to Hispanic heritage, with much of the City located on Rancho Los Cerritos, a Spanish land grant that shaped the development of the region. This deep connection to Spanish and Mexican culture is a core part of Paramount's identity, reflected in its partnerships and community programs.

One such partnership is the City's relationship with Tepic, Mexico, established through the Sister Cities program. Paramount and Tepic have worked together for years on a range of initiatives, from book donations to public schools and libraries, to fundraisers to purchase braille computers for the Blind Center in Tepic. These efforts have strengthened educational and social bonds between the two cities, emphasizing that unity and cooperation truly transcends borders.

Paramount's collaboration with the *Latinas Art Foundation* provides a platform for Hispanic artists and creatives to showcase their work within the community. Events such as *Xantolo: Día de Los Muertos*, highlight the importance of historic cultural traditions while promoting self-expression and artistic innovation.



Paramount's dedication to recognizing Hispanic heritage extends well beyond this celebratory month, and in these difficult days it includes standing up for the civil rights of our residents of Hispanic ethnicity, as well as others targeted by immigration enforcement activities. That is why Paramount has joined with the City of Los Angeles and a dozen other local communities in a lawsuit which alleges that federal agencies, including ICE and CBP, have conducted unconstitutional and unlawful stops, roundups and raids without reasonable suspicion or probable cause.

"Our decision to intervene in this lawsuit is about standing up for civil rights," said Paramount Mayor Peggy Lemons. "No one in our community should be subjected to unlawful treatment or targeted based on race or ethnicity. We believe in due process, fairness and the responsibility to hold all levels of government accountable when those principles are lost."  **PROTECT PARAMOUNT'S TREES – DON'T HACK, DON'T TOP, DON'T OVER-PRUNE!** 

The City of Paramount is committed to protecting our community's tree canopy. Recently, we've seen an alarming trend of severe tree cutting and "hacking" on commercial properties. Paramount has been recognized as a Tree City USA recipient for 7 years in a row. As a sustainable city, maintaining our urban forest is a shared responsibility. This practice is harmful to trees, creates safety hazards, and is strictly prohibited by City ordinance.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- ✓ Light, seasonal pruning is allowed for health and maintenance.
- ✗ Severe cutting, topping, or "hacking" of mature trees is not allowed.
- ✗ Property owners who violate the ordinance may face enforcement actions and fines.

WHY IT MATTERS

Over-pruning damages trees, shortens their lifespan, and leaves them vulnerable to disease.

Healthy trees provide shade, improve property values, and enhance our City's image.

NEED HELP?
